 Samson Laar is the coordinator of the Gambaga witch camp. There are currently 88 people, 85 women and 3 men living under protection in the camp. In Ghana alone there are 6 witch camps in total housing around a thousand women.

Silvia Federici is a feminist activist, teacher and the writer of *Caliban and the Witch: Women, the Body and Primitive Accumulation, Witches, witch-hunting and women* and several other books.

In 1972 she was one of the cofounders of the International Feminist Collective, the organization that launched the Wages For Housework campaign internationally. In the 1990s, after a period of teaching and research in Nigeria, she was active in the anti-globalization movement and the U.S. anti-death penalty movement. From 1987 to 2005 she taught international studies, women studies, and political philosophy courses at Hofstra University in Hempstead, NY. All through these years she has written books and essays on philosophy and feminist theory, women's history, education and culture, and more recently the worldwide struggle against capitalist globalization and for a feminist reconstruction of the commons.
