MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 15, 2025

- 13.00 **Departure from Stavanger City**: Pick up by by car at Stavanger Central station/Bus station. Change to the Yellow bus at the airport (same drivers).

14.15-14:30	In the main building titled Veferden (white brick building) Reading and material presentation by Marte Jonslien in the reception area downstairs.
14:30-15:00	Performance lecture <i>The Souls of White Folk</i> by Martin White in the Projectroom, located next to the reception area in the Veferden building. (Next to Martes reading)

14:00 -20:00 Exhibitions are open Tuesday and from 14:00-19:00 on Wednesday.

Eline Benjaminsen:

Screening of *The Flora of Finance*, encompassing two collaborative video essays made in 2024; The Flora: 'Hedging' (11:30 minutes) authored together with Dayna Casey and *Footprints in the Valley* (8.30 minutes) authored together with Elias Kimaiyo.

Linda Lamingnan:

Screening of the film DIRIMOR, 2024. Video with sound 12:24 min. Music composition by Nova Varnrable, intro and outro animation by Kristoffer Ammundsen.

Lamingnan is the current Resident Artist at Velferden.

Siri Austeen:

To gather a mountain. Field recordings from Titania.

Austeen is a former Resident Artist at Veferden and a part of the project AVGANG/DEPONI that deals with the challenges concerning disposal of mining waste, in the form of sand and dust.

Austeen will also do a sound performance - *Bush Agitation part 2*, Wednesday night.

Miriam Hansen and Andreas Olavssønn Rongen:

DAY 4 - ROADTRIP

THURSDAY, SEPTEMBER 18, 2025

Breakfast and check out.

Please place your luggage on the bus between 09:15-09:30. Please note that you will not be returning to the hotel.

Ca 09:30 Departure for all by bus to **Helleren**. (15 minutes drive)

This is a special place with traces of human settlement since the Stoneage with two small houses on the settlement sites, built in 16-1700. There is also the new Jøssingfjord Science Museum next to it, where you can do a (very) short visit if you like. It tells the story of mining, extractivism, geology and the historiy of the area with rich findings of old petroglyphs and traces from the Viking age. It is adviced to visit the houses first.

PS: For artists that need to stop by Veferden in the morning you will go with Tanja Sæter and staff and **not** visit Helleren. We will meet up with the others at Hå by car. But this should not apply to many as most will be ready. If you are ready and have all your things, please take the bus.

10:30 Departure by bus from Helleren to **Hå gamle presetegård.** We will drive by the coastal route running trough Jæren, along the South-West coast of Norway. (1.30 hour drive)

We will have a generous preview of the exhibition *Proxies for Poets and Palaces* (opening September 27) by Iraqi-American artist **Michael Rakowitz**, by the curator, followed by lunch for you at the museum. Please note that the artist also has a sculpture – a lamassu, titled *The Invisible Enemy Should Not Exist* (Lamassu from Ninive) in front of <u>Stavanger Cathedral</u> as a part of his collaboration with the museum. Helga Nyman also previously curated the exhibition *Experiences of Oil* at the museum with Anne Szefer Karlsen and will present content from this project as well and speak about their collection.

About Proxies for Poets and Palaces:

Iraqi-American artist Michael Rakowitz (b. 1973) has an ambitious project: he seeks to preserve stories and memories associated with places and objects that no longer exist. Since 2007, he has worked on reappearing the cultural artifacts lost or destroyed in the aftermath of the US-led invasion of Iraq. Rakowitz highlights the many layered effects of centuries of imperialism and the ways the destruction of art and culture parallel the destruction of life. Arnau Horta holds a PhD in Philosophy at the Universitat Autónoma de Barcelona, and develops his activity in the field of curatorship, teaching, cultural criticism and artistic research.

Sofie B. Ringstad. Writer and curator based in Stavanger. and the general manager and editor of CAS – Contemporary Art Stavanger.

This panel of international writers/critics will explore art and cultural criticism's effective potential, including alternative forms of critique.

While reviews are greatly sought after by artists and institutions in the region, very few media outlets in the Rogaland region publish art criticism, and writing and publishing critical reflections in an interconnected and locally specific art community comes with its own set of challenges.

In this panel, we pose questions such as: What if we expand the idea of art critique? Are there ways to look at and write about art that empower both the writer and receiver? And

is it possible to take the pressure off of cultural and art critique as a format, without losing its potency? As we face the international rise of right wing ideologies, what is the responsibility and potential of art criticism?
